Dear Colleague,

Today the Mayor and I have launched our consultation on the draft Police and Crime Plan for London. In this document, the Mayor sets out how he believes we can continue to deliver for Londoners, building on the work of the last mayoralty, to make our city a safer place for everyone.

Safer communities are the foundation of London's success and must be the bedrock of our recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic. Our vision is therefore both for London to be a safer city, with crime falling, and for Londoners to feel safer as they go about their daily lives.

To deliver this vision the draft Police and Crime Plan sets out some key objectives, namely:

- reducing and preventing violence;
- increasing trust and confidence in the MPS;
- better supporting victims; and,
- protecting people from exploitation and harm.


The formal consultation on the draft Plan runs until **Friday 21 January 2022**, and the final Police and Crime Plan will be published before the end of March 2022.

It is worth noting that in parallel to this consultation MOPAC is also developing a refreshed Strategy for combatting violence against women and girls (VAWG). As a key element of the wider Police and Crime Plan we would be happy to hear your views on this as part of this consultation.
